109/17 **POLICE MONTHLY UPDATE**

They continue to visit rural schools in the area, and have been giving talks with year 5 and 6 pupils on Internet Safety.

PCSO Norton-Smith recently attended the Art Club at the Community Hall and Sports Pavilion and left some Halloween posters with the group so they can put the posters in their windows to state they do not want "Trick or Treaters" at their properties. Hopefully this has helped to reduce any unwanted visitors!

Speed Enforcement is ongoing, and further dates are to be arranged during November. We are still actively seeking volunteers to set up their own Speed Watch Community Groups, in their own or surrounding villages. If you have 3 or 4 volunteers who are interested, please contact the PCSO, and it can be discussed further. Other local villages which have adopted this scheme have been very successful. Their efforts have already had a significant impact on speeding issues in their village. Community Speed Watch Teams can not only educate drivers regarding their speeds, but also provide Police with location and times where Enforcement checks can be undertaken to the best advantage.

CRIMES IN THE GOREFIELD AREA OCTOBER 2017

2 x Burglaries
1 x Arson (not endangering life)

GENERAL CONCERNS

There has been an increase in shed burglaries in some of the north rural areas of Wisbech, where large quantities of tools, and farm machinery batteries have been stolen.

There have also had several reports of theft of domestic heating oil within the rural areas, where full tanks of oil have been stolen.

Hare Coursing is an ongoing problem, and the coursers are often operating on the border of Cambridgeshire and Lincolnshire, as it is easier to escape the Police by going cross border into a different county. The Hare Coursers are often in large type 4x4 vehicles, so if you see anything suspicious, please report it to the Police.

There have also been several thefts of lead from rooftops from various building types across Cambridgeshire. Please check buildings regularly for any signs of lead theft, as considerable damage can be caused when this is removed.

Whilst regular Police patrols are undertaken in the rural villages, we encourage the public to report all crimes. By reporting all crimes, it helps to identify the areas of criminality, and we can then determine which areas would benefit from additional Police patrols.

The installation of security lights and CCTV cameras (where possible) are a good deterrent in preventing crime. Further crime prevention advice can be found on the Cambridgeshire Constabulary website.

110/17 **MATTERS ARISING ON THE AGENDA**

(1) **Highway Matters**

Meeting held at Bellamy Bridge attended by the three Parish Councils (Wisbech St Mary, Parson Drove and Gorefield). The Local Highway officer is to obtain a price for the re-lining of the junction. A LHI application is to be submitted jointly by all three Councils applying for the maximum £10K.

This Parish Council has already put in an LHI application for speed reduction measures for High Road. The Council will wait for the outcome of this before any agreement can be made as to the expenditure to be committed to the Bellamy Bridge project

(2) **Play Equipment**

Latest report points out that the fixing is broken on the back stop of the zip line. The Chairman will inspect this

(3) **Streetlight Gote Lane**

The streetlight contractors have attended this site because the streetlight was reported as on all the time. They were unable to undertake any repairs as a local resident stated that it was in his front garden and refused access. A suggestion was made that the light be taken away.

(4) **Defibrillator Training**

Training session has been arranged for Tuesday 2nd November at 7 pm in the Community Hall.

(5) **Request from a member of the public for a Bus Shelter**

The Council has previously tried to install bus shelters but nowhere suitable was ever found to site one. If a suitable site could be found the Parish Council would be very pleased to get one installed.

(6) **Updating and adoption of Standing Orders and Financial Regulations**

Updated copies of these have been circulated to all Councillors before the meeting. It was unanimously agreed that these updated documents be adopted by the Council.
