### GENERAL CONCERNS

There have been several issues of hare coursing in the rural areas of Wisbech. If you are aware of this happening in Gorefield, please contact the police.

There have been several reports of heating oil theft. Advice on how to protect your oil tank from thieves, and other crime prevention advice can be found on the Cambridgeshire Police website, or contact the local crime prevention officer on 101.

Dwelling burglaries and shed burglaries are still happening in Wisbech and the surrounding rural villages. If you see anything suspicious, please report it to the police.

**(1) Highway Matters**

E-mail received from a member of the public stating that Mr Nicholson the Highways Officer and some of the Morrison utility workers have been seen surveying the area at the top of Gote Lane opposite the Church. Hopefully in the near future something is done to resolve the flooding problem in this area.

E-mail received from Steve Nicholson answering questions posed to him by Councillor Clark. Hounds teeth on Wolf Lane have been passed back to Projects who were responsible for ordering the installation. Road markings at east and west entrances to the village have now been re-done. Reinstatement of the highway where damaged by bus has been done. The 30 mph sign which has been installed at the western end of the village is now at the prescribed height for such signs therefore it is at a different level to that opposite.

Local Highway Improvement funding 2018/19 – the application for this should be in by 15<sup>th</sup> October. Agreed that a scheme for traffic calming at the eastern and western approaches to the village should be put in. One suggestion was gated entrances to give the impression of the narrowing of the road to slow traffic down.

Several e-mails have been received about the junction at Bellamy's Bridge which is on the boundaries of Wisbech St Mary, Parson Drove and Gorefield Parish Councils. Over the years suggestions have been as to how this junction can be improved but nothing has happened. A meeting is to be arranged with all Parish Council chairmen and clerks and Cambs CC and Fenland DC members. It was suggested that the Local Highway Improvement funding could be used jointly with the other Parish Councils.

**(2) Play Equipment**

The zip wire required repairs shortly after the last meeting. Fenland Leisure Products were asked to look at it and quote for the work needed. Some work was carried out FOC charge to get it working again but further work is required which will cost £245.47 + VAT. They have been given the go ahead to do the work.

Latest Play area inspection states that the Willow tunnel needs pruning still.

**(3) Defibrillator**

Local electrician Alan Clarke has agreed to install the defibrillator

**(4) Village health and safety report**

Councillor Mrs Hunns carried this out. Points noted – Village Sign base need weeding, Notice Board outside school need cleaning, bench on Pocket Park needs attention, seats at Richmond Green and outside church need cleaning up. The one outside the Church is not the responsibility of the Parish Council. Councillor Mrs Hall will mention this to the PCC.

Chairman will speak to a local tradesman about getting some of these small jobs done also including the cutting of the hedge on the Pocket Park

**Streetlights**

A letter has been received Councillor King setting out Fenland DC's proposals for the future repair, management and replacement of Parish Council streetlights:

A free inventory and condition survey, this will include the rectification of any routine or minor faults and will be wholly funded by Fenland DC.

The free future management of Parish Council street lighting stock and service requests

The free re-labelling of Parish Council street lights

Repairs, maintenance and energy will in future be funded by Parish Councils at an estimated cost of between 47 and £67 per column per annum. Actual costs will be confirmed as part of the procurement process.

Each Parish Council will remain responsible for funding the replacement of defective columns, knock downs and new columns.

Gorefield PC have 50 street lights which includes the one opposite Glebe Close which was put up by the Developer.

It was unanimously agreed that Gorefield Parish Council wishes Fenland DC to manage their street lights.
