41/23 MATTERS ARISING ON THE AGENDA

(1) Highway Matters

E-mail received from residents of High Road complaining about excessive speeding through the village. They are going to make a report to the Police and Highways, for which the Council thank them for. Over many years measures have been taken to try to reduce the speed of vehicles by getting the speed limit reduced down to 30 mph, the introduction of interactive signs and village gateways and 40 mph buffer zones at the entries and exit of the village. An application has been made for a 20 mph zone in front of the school.

Councillor Mrs Cutler attended the meeting, she is Gorefield PC's newly elected Fenland DC Councillor. She is also the co-ordinator for Speed Watch for Parson Drove and Wisbech St Mary. She said that as Gorefield is now part of this ward it can also be included in the scheme. All agree that this would be a very good idea. Volunteers from the village would required to help run the scheme. Speed Watch would undertake to deliver leaflets etc to residents to see if anyone would be interested. Councillor Mrs Cutler will email all the information to the clerk shortly

Councillor King was unable to attend the meeting but had e-mailed a report. Patching and plainings have been done along High Side and Wolf Lane. 40 mph sign along High Road has been replaced and 30 mph sign has been ordered and will be replaced shortly. Tree overhanging Gote Lane has now been removed. Councillor Thatcher reported to Councillor King that some of the new trees planted in Oxfield Drive have been damaged possibly by the grass cutter. Councillor King has contacted Natalie Fulk at Tillia and she will find out who the contractors are who do the grass cutting and advise them to take more care around the trees

(2) Co-Option of Councillors

Mrs N Hempsall attended this meeting and a previous one and in interested in joining the Council. It was proposed by Councillor Humphrey and seconded by Councillor Thatcher that she be co-opted on to the Council. Chairman welcomed her to the Council.
