## GUYHIRN CHURCH FOR SALE

St Mary Magdalene Church, Guyhirn, is to be sold. The 132-year-old Victorian church, together with its grounds, will be converted into two dwellings, subject to planning and listed building consent, but will keep all the distinctive features of the Grade II listed building. Offers in the region of £300,000 are invited by the agents, Jolliffe Daking, of Peterborough. Included in the sale is an adjoining residential development site which has planning consent for a terrace of five dwellings.

This is the latest chapter in the life of the church which was built in 1878 to a design by the renowned architect Sir George Gilbert Scott. Up to the 1950s it had a thriving congregation and boasted a choir of 30. In 2006 it was declared redundant, and discussions commenced as to its future role in the village.

The village war memorial will remain in its present position and is not, of course, included in the sale.

## REMEMBRANCE SERVICES WELL ATTENDED

Wisbech St Mary & Guyhirn church was filled on Remembrance Sunday when the congregations of the parish church and the Methodist church joined to commemorate those from the parishes who gave their lives in the two World Wars, and those from the United Kingdom who died more recently in Afghanistan. Father Matthew Bradbury conducted the service.

Members of the Royal British Legion, WSM Parish Councillors, The Scout and Guide Associations and members of the congregation placed wreaths and crosses at the base of the great east window of the church which is the village war memorial.

At midday a wreath-laying ceremony, led by Brian Payne, was held at the Guyhirn war memorial.

At Emmanuel church, Parson Drove, the Remembrance service was conducted by Lilian Brigden, who afterwards presided at a wreath-laying service at Murrow war memorial. Lilian said, "How wonderful to see so many friends at our services. As I looked round and saw all the poppies that were worn, I thanked God for everyone who remembered, for the music that set the scene, and for those who stood to pay their respects. We will remember them".

The shops are stocking up their shelves with extra goodies, and the television is advertising toys and games for children, so Christmas must be just around the corner. In the lead up to Christmas we are often busy thinking about what presents we are going to buy, or what food and drink we are going to get in, and we get a bit lax when it comes to security. The presents you have just bought get left on display in the car for all to see. As you are loading the car up you leave the keys in the ignition. Don't leave property on view in your car. Always close windows and lock all doors. Never leave keys in the ignition.

When you get the shopping home keep presents and valuables out of sight. Dispose of packaging carefully. Keep doors locked. . ## A JUBILEE OAK FALLS AT PARSON DROVE

The appearance of Parson Drove village green, near the Cage, has been significantly changed following the loss of a large oak tree outside the *Swan Inn*. During the night of October 2nd/3<sup>rd</sup> a very large branch of the tree fell, and a subsequent inspection found that the tree was rotten, and it had to be felled.

The tree, an English Oak, was planted to commemorate the Golden Jubilee of Queen Victoria's reign in 1887. It was always treated with respect by the village, and there was an understanding that during various activities on the Green nothing would be done to harm the tree. The oak tree close by is a Red, or Canadian, Oak and was planted to celebrate Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee. The main difference between the two trees could be seen in the appearance of their acorns. A few older residents may remember that this tree was surrounded by iron railings with a commemorative plaque

## Voices Past

### **The Death of the Revd Frederic Jackson**

The Reverend Frederic Jackson, the venerable vicar of Parson Drove, died on October 12<sup>th</sup> 1904 in his 87<sup>th</sup> year. He had held the living since January 1844. He was the son of the Rev Jeremiah Jackson, [former] vicar of Elm, Wisbech, and was the last survivor of a family of eighteen. He graduated at St John's College, Cambridge, where he and his brothers were considerable athletes in their day. A keen sportsman, he made horse exercise his favourite occupation, practised until late in life. When obliged to give up he rarely missed his daily drive. It was to plenty of fresh air, he has repeatedly assured the writer, that he attributed his great vitality.

A typical Fenman of the past generation, he took great interest in drainage which has revolutionized the landscape within his memory. The Fens are no longer a panorama of bogs and marshes, the home or birthplace of Will o' the Wisp, agues, malarial fevers, the devils that long ago tormented Crowland's patron saint. The Fens have changed too since Pepys visited his cousins at Parson Drove in 1663. It was thirty years later in 1692 that Henri Pujolas, an evicted Huguenot, became vicar. He died at the ripe age of 98 years after holding his cure 57 years. He was succeeded in turn by John Dickinson, vicar for 41 years, Richard Pollard for 49 years, and Frederic Jackson 60 years (during 43 of which he claimed never to have missed a Sunday service). The old sexton, Michael Sargison; "Mike the gravedigger" he was usually called, which rather pleased the old man, claimed to have opened the church door when Mr Jackson first entered, and he dug his grave.

That the late vicar and his three predecessors, none of whom were fenmen born and inured to the climate, covered a period of not less than 212 years, speaks well of the district.

Please do attend and voice your opinion on any subject relevant to the Parish during the Open Forum at the beginning of each meeting. The Parish Council is very pleased that at least four parishioners are attending the Parish Council meetings on a regular basis, together with a representative from the Police, District Coun Robert Scrimshaw, County Coun Mrs Jill Tuck and Fenland District Council Neighbourhood Community Development Officer.

The Neighbourhood Community Development Officer is working with parish councils to update the Village Plans to try and gain grants to enable as much as possible from each of the Village Actions Plans to be brought to fruition.

### **Precept**

The Parish Council on November 8th 2010 built a budget for the financial year 2011/2012 and has set the precept at £43732.00, **no increase on last year's precept**. Councillors felt in these difficult times that they were unable to justify any increase. They intend to continue with the grants to local clubs and organisations as far as possible within financial constraints,

### **Highway Matters**

The Parish Council again put forward two bids for jointly funded minor highway improvements. As you may remember these bids were for a footpath at Bunkers Hill from Rat Row to Bridge Inn and a footpath in Station Road, Wisbech St Mary. To date we have not been informed as to whether we have been successful.

The Parish Council continues to identify areas that are in need of streetlights and if you know of an area where a streetlight is needed, please contact either one of the councillors listed above or the clerk.

The Parish Council continues to identify roads and footpaths that are in need of repair and continues to lobby the County Highways Department to ensure that this work is carried out as soon as possible.

We continue to carry out maintenance work on all bus shelters owned by the Parish Council.

### **Action Group**

The Action Group set up in Guyhirn to renovate the village pond, which is owned by the Parish Council, continue to carry out work to improve this area. At the moment the Action Group, with the authority of the Parish Council, are trying to reduce the size of the pond to make a larger bank area on which to install seats, etc, to make it more accessible and therefore, enabling the people of Guyhirn to enjoy the wildlife and plants.
