## *Vicar's Verbals.*

The thing about recovering from surgery is that it makes you realise how lucky you are to be getting better. Its like the old joke: "Why on earth are you banging your face against that brick wall?" "Because its so nice when I stop!". I only had a minor op a couple of weeks ago, but the sickness after the anaesthetic, the pain of the wound and the general helplessness afterwards are a timely reminder to me that others have to face much worse, with only the prospect of yet more illness and suffering. Being a short term invalid is a humbling experience and I have had to learn the real meaning of the term 'patient', and to receive the kindness and care of others with graciousness. It reminds me that I am always reliant upon others in sickness or in health. It is one of the mysteries of the Christian way that Jesus was at his most powerful when he made himself completely vulnerable to others. If you are sick or undergoing unpleasant treatment at the moment, then my prayers are with you. I pray that you are blessed by people around you to care for you and love you in your time of difficulty. Be powerful in your weakness by allowing others to be blessed by the kindness and love which your plight is generating in them. You are a centre for their grace and may offer them a glimpse of their own salvation.

*In the light of recent concerns in their village, Guyhirn readers may be interested in the following extract from the "Cambridge Chronicle" published 155 years ago. The Wesleyan chapel stood near the village hall until it was demolished some twenty years ago.*

## "VICE AND IMMORALITY LEAVE GUYHIRN

(as reported in the "Cambridge Chronicle" 17 June 1854)

"The anniversary in connection with the Wesleyan chapel at Guyhirn was celebrated on Sunday last, when sermons were preached to overflowing congregations and liberal collections made.

"On Monday the children of the Sabbath School were regaled with tea, after which the teachers, parents and friends partook of the friendly cup, the little chapel being beautifully decorated with flowers for the occasion.

"The evening was most agreeably and profitably spent in listening to the recital of pieces of prose and verse by some of the children, and to the addresses of the friends of religious instruction, who had assembled to encourage the teachers in their work of faith and labour of love.

"To those who knew the locality a few years since, the moral and social improvement is most striking. Formerly proverbial for vice and immorality, the inhabitants are now distinguished for sobriety and piety, and afford a gratifying example of what, by the Divine blessing, men may do towards working out their own reformation".

## IS IT A PLANE? IS IT A TREE? ....OR BOTH?

In the 12 months leading up to this Parish Assembly there have been 15 meetings and all councillors have attended on a regular basis, together with County Councillor Jill Tuck, District Councillors Cyril Bellamy and Robert Scrimshaw and Pc J Coales (Community Beat Police Constable). A number of parishioners have attended to take advantage of the Open Forum item which appears on each meeting's agenda.

The members of the Parish Council all live within the Parish and several also work within the area. They represent a cross section of the community and therefore are on hand to recognise and deal with the needs and concerns of the parishioners they serve. Several of the councillors represent the parish on committees and organisations within Fenland and by doing so the voice of the parish is heard.

Mr J Parrin is on the committee of the Fenland Links Board, Fenland Association of Local Councils and Treasurer of the Parson Drove Car Scheme and the Wisbech St Mary Car Scheme. Mr B Payne is a Parish Council Representative on the Standards Committee of Fenland District Council and Fenland Association of Local Councils.

Several Councillors are members of the Poores Allotment Charity, Village Hall Committees, Playing Field Committees and are School Governors and other community based organisations.

#### **Parish Plans**

The Parish Plan was completed in 2005 and this now being updated. The Action Plans for each of the villages, Guyhirn, Murrow and Wisbech St Mary, with the help of Fenland Links and Cambridgeshire Acre are already being considered. The Parish Council will support these Action Groups to enable them to bring as many items as possible to fruition within financial constraints. The Public Consultation meetings in all three villages and Thorney Toll have taken place.

#### **Village Property**

During the past 12 months the Council has continued to maintain the bus shelters. After consultation with CCC Highways Dept and a local builder the Parish Council is in the process of carrying out work on the bus shelter at Chapelfield Road, Guyhirn to make it more user friendly for the disabled.

The Parish Council from the Capital Fund have purchased additional land from the Fenland District Council to increase the size of the Guyhirn Playing Field and made a grant to the Wisbech St Mary Community Centre of £45,000 towards the new Community Centre.

During this financial year grants have been given to various organisations within the Parish. (Details from the Clerk)

#### **Highways**

Councillors continue to identify areas that are in need of repair and continue to lobby the County Highways Department to ensure that this work is carried out as soon as possible. This year we put in two bids for jointly funded minor highway improvements. These were a for a new footpath in Bunkers Hill from Rat Row to Bridge Inn and High Road, Wisbech St Mary. We have been informed that neither of these bids was successful. We will try again next year.

The Council are continuing to work towards reducing speed limits within the Parish and therefore creating a safer environment for us all.

Councillors have continually corresponded with the Police to try and increase the safety outside our schools. In previous years we were successful in initiating parking restrictions outside Wisbech St Mary School and traffic calming near Murrow School in Murrow Bank. This year we have installed from Parish Council funds road markings in Guyhirn warning of a school. We will continue to work towards improving road safety outside all of our schools.

After numerous serious accidents at Bellamy Bridge, the Parish Council continue to lobby Cambridgeshire County Council Highways Department to improve this junction. To date the road markings and signage have been improved, but we will continue to request the Police and the Highways Dept to make this area as safe as possible.

#### **Parish Precept**

The Precept in the 2005/2006 financial year was £28,000, 2006/2007 £29,400, 2007/2008 £30870, 2008/2009 £43732 and in 2009/2010 we have made no increase and it remains at £43732.

Finally, if you wish to make your voice heard on any aspect of village life, please feel free to attend any of the Parish Council meetings.
