It's a wonderful thing to be able to complete a task. I have just finished laying gravel on an unused and overgrown portion of the vicarage front garden which was at one time a vegetable patch tended by one of my predecessors. A large roll of permeable membrane and three tons of 2mil gravel have now transformed the wilderness into a useful area for some extra parking at busy times. Half way through the work, with a diminishing pile of gravel still to be shovelled and raked, my arms and back aching and large areas of black sheeting still visible, I really wondered whether I would ever complete the task and began to doubt the wisdom of attempting it myself. But when I had finished I was able, with a sense of satisfaction, to thank the Lord for four good hours of progress and something lasting to show for it. Then it occurred to me that there are precious few occasions when we can actually say we have finished a piece of work. Most of what we do in life is part of a longer continuum; our work can sometimes be a succession of seemingly endless and unrewarding tasks which merge one into another. We may not even be around to see the fruits of our labours. Even raising our children is followed, when they become independent, with worrying about their careers, their romances and their own families. Looking out at the gravelled area I can at least stop worrying about having to keep it tidy..... until the weeds start to poke their heads through the gravel that Matthew. is!

CHAPEL OF EASE 350

BID TO REVITALISE GUYHIRN VILLAGE POND

The Guyhirn Pond Working Party is asking everyone from all villages who would like to see Guyhirn village pond restored to a more attractive looking feature. Wisbech St Mary Parish Council has assisted by having the dangerous trees removed, and the remainder pollarded.

Brenda Reay says, "The ideal thing to do with the pond is to terrace the banks to make it easier to maintain, and to drag and dispose of the excessive duckweed from the pond. Plant some more water based plants around the pond and to fill in part of one end so that a seating area can be designed with decorative plants.

At present the moorhens are hatching some chicks. We also have toads/newts etc in the pond, so the work we did last year seems to be paying off and attracting wildlife back. At present the water level is far too high to be able to work safely, but I am sure this will change in the next few weeks and a working area will be dry enough".

Anyone wishing to help to get the pond back to an attractive amenity please contact either Terry or Brenda on 450815. As a group, it will only take a few hours per week to clear the pond and surrounding area and the more help the Working Party can get the sooner it will look nicer.

Following the Fair a panel meeting was held to set the priority for the coming months for the villages. It was disappointing to see only two members of the public attending the meeting. This meeting gives you the public the opportunity to help set the policing priorities. It was decided that the priority would be speeding issues on Leverington Common. The priorities that had been set at another meeting in Wisbech included Anti Social Behaviour in the Market Place and Norfolk Street, and issues with motorcycles in Meadowgate Lane. You might think that these meeting are a waste of time, but the government says that the Police must engage with the public via Panel meetings in order to set the priorities. Fenland District Council decides how we consult with the public. The way the Community Fairs and Panel meetings are held is currently under review.

The Crime Buster bus is out and about on a regular basis in the villages and the dates/venues are advertised well in advance. This is another opportunity for you to come along if you have any issues or concerns. The bus is usually manned by representatives from the Police, Roddons and Fenland District Council.
