LUCKY ESCAPE

as reported in the "Wisbech Telegraph" Saturday 23 June 1860:

"On Tuesday morning a Mr Watson, of Wisbech St Mary, was driving to Lynn with two young ladies when his horse took fright near the boundary of Tilney St Lawrence parish, and ran backwards into a very steep and dangerous drain, there being seven or eight feet of water.

Mr Watson got out of the cart before it was in the water and escaped unhurt.

The two young ladies received some bruises and a cooling bath, but were rescued without serious injuries. Great fear was entertained that the horse would be drowned, but by cutting the harness and cart shafts the horse, said to worth one hundred and fifty pounds, was set free. Mr Watson liberally rewarded the men who assisted."

BAND OF HOPE MEETINGS

"Guyhirn South Brink Band of Hope Temperence meeting was held on Tuesday 14th inst, when upwards of 100 persons sat down to tea. 13 people signed pledges.

STRAYING STOCK IN ROGUES' ALLEY

as reported in the "Wisbech Advertiser" in 1880

JOSEPH SMITH, a farmer of 67 acres, of Cant's Drove, was charged with allowing four horses and two cows to stray on the highway in Wisbech St Mary parish on 27th June. Defendant admitted the charge, and was fined 1s with 8s costs.

DANIEL WARD, of Wisbech St Mary parish, pleaded guilty to allowing a horse to stray on the highway on the 27th June, and was ordered to pay 4s costs.

BENJAMIN DUXON, of Cant's Drove, was also charged with allowing four horses, four cows, and two calves to stray on the highway on the 27th June. Defendant pleaded guilty. Fined 10s and 8s costs. The defendant said "I'll have them on the road every day and night too".

JOHN CLAXTON, of Gull Drove, was charged with allowing a cow to stray on the 27th June.

Defendant denied the charge, which was proved by Pc Butcher, and he was ordered to pay 1s fine and 9s costs.

WILLIAM FARMEADOWS, farmer, of Wisbech Fen, was charged with allowing a cow to stray on the highway in that parish on the 6th September.

Defendant's mother appeared, and admitted the charge. Ordered to pay 3s costs.

BENJAMIN DUXON, Senr., of Cant's Drove, pleaded guilty to allowing three cows, a mare, and a foal, to stray on the highway on the 2nd September. Fined 4s and 6s 6d costs. The defendant said he would not pay, as it was not his fault that the stock was on the road, they having broken out. The Clerk said that unless the money was paid a distress warrant would be issued. The Defendant said he could not help it, and left the Court without paying.

JOHN LISTER, farmer, of Wisbech Fen, was summoned for allowing a cow and a calf to stray on the highway on the 6th September.

Defendant's wife appeared, and pleaded guilty. Ordered to pay 3s costs.
